

Camping

There are 14 traditional campgrounds in the area offering camping spaces reserved for both tents and recreational vehicles. Most camping spaces are along the shores of Lake Dillon in two maintained campgrounds. Spaces fill quickly and reservations are required, sometimes weeks in advance for summer weekends and the entire month of August.

Not all campgrounds take reservations, however the following do:

- Heaton Bay with 72 spaces
- Lowry Campground with 29 spaces
- Peak One Campground with 79 spaces
- Prospector Campground with 109 spaces
